

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FROM LOCKDOWN TO RESILIENCE: REAL CHANGE IN EDUCATION DELIVERY



For a social system like education, systems resilience can be defined as (i) the capacity of an enterprise to survive, adapt and grow in the face of turbulent change and (ii) the capacity of a system to experience shocks while retaining essentially the same function, structure, feedbacks and therefore identity.

One of the important lessons from COVID-19 pandemic is that all aspects of education must become more resilient to avoid disruptions from future risks including pandemics, natural disasters, the effects of climate change and rapid social and technological changes. Experience in the last year points the way for policy and investment post-pandemic to reform teaching and widen access to education for all learners in line

with the UN Sustainable Development Goals. Technology is playing an increasingly very important role in education post pandemic era. Access to digital learning has improved rapidly thanks to increased network access, cheaper smart phones and tablets and affordability of data.

Teachers and students themselves are key actors in building resilience, which encompasses social and emotional learning, mental health, psychological and social support. Broadening the focus of education to include emotional and psychological resilience alongside academic learning strengthens the resilience of students individually contributing to a more resilient society.

During the year 2021 the Institute embraced digitally assisted, blended flexible approaches to teaching and learning, new modes of assessment and improved ways of training and incentivizing lecturers. Our very well attended and impactful blended International Colloquium on the 16th September 2021 brought over 1,200 participants from all over the world to discuss the theme "Recalibrating Open Distance Education and E-Learning for Resilience and Inclusivity". The colloquium brought to the fore the overarching issues of equity challenges, affordability of new technologies, quality assurance and regulatory frameworks. Finally, it was agreed that not enough attention is being paid to learners — what they want and how they learn. Teachers and policy-makers seem to be speaking for learners a lot, using anecdotes to represent wholesale demands, to be made on their behalf. COVID-19 made this even noiser.

In this lingering pandemic and the uncertainty that has destabilized so much of our lives and routines, our processes in the Institute has been to address issues of equity and inclusion across four key vertical dimensions: access and enrolment, student engagement, retention/attrition and completion/graduation. The Institute is committed to serve students throughout their educational journey.

Our modest effort in ensuring the most effective and efficient way to deliver on our mandate in 2021 is presented in this report.

E INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

During the year under review the following underlisted projects were accomplished.

(i) CCTV coverage of the DLI premises

The Closed Circuit TV coverage of the entire DLI premises has been completed and it is running optimally and achieving the desired results. The Management has used the CCTV footage to solve some of its security challenges.

(ii) Generators

Purchase of the 350KVA Generator

The 350KVA generator has been purchased form JUPEB and has been installed and waiting to be commissioned by the Vice Chancellor.

- The old 250KVA generator has been handed over to the Director of Works and Physical Planning.
- The 40KVA generator donated by an Alumnus of DLI through the CSR initiative of his company I H S (Nigeria) Ltd was also handed over to the University Management.
- (iii) Toilets in the Main Administrative Block
 All the 21 toilets in the main administrative block have been renovated.
- (iv) Toilets in Block A & B

 Work has started with the toilets in Block A. 15 out of the 30 has been renovated.

 Work is still in progress to renovate all the 60 toilets in the two blocks.
- (v) The Server Room
 The Server Room in the E-Resource Centre was renovated with 2 new air conditioners installed to achieve optimal temperature for the equipment.
- (vi) Staff Offices
 Renovation of offices and purchase of office furniture for staff continued during the year.


i. INTERNATIONAL COLLOQUIUM

There was also a panel discussion moderated by Veteran broadcast journalist, Mrs. Eugenia Abu. The panel discussion comprised renowned professionals:


- **Dr. Neil Fassina**, President of the International Council for Distance Education (ICDE) presented the keynote address on the theme of the colloquium.










ii. MATRICULATION CEREMONY

G THE STUDENT ACTIVITIES

The Distance Learning Institute Students' Association (DLISA), held the underlisted programs during the 2019/2020 session:

- 1. Student Support Program: An annual student's financial aid program of N10,000 each to 50 less Privileged DLI Students for the purpose of making up their school fees. Only students with a good academic standing (not on probation or warning) are eligible. This mild support was intended only for students that truly need it (that is, those finding it difficult completing their school fees). Due to the COVID -19 global pandemic, application for this scheme was done online. Fifty successful applicants got awarded within the budget for the scheme which is five hundred thousand naira only (N500,000).
- 2. DLISA Debate: The DLISA debate was an intellectually driven program aimed at encouraging critical reasoning skills among DLI students. It offers an excellent way to model their analytical and communicative thought process on any subject. The 2019/2020 debate took a British parliamentary form titled; THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON OPEN DISTANCE LEARNING. The Debate was Hybrid (Physical / Online).

Department of Education came first wining the star prize of #80,000 Naira while Business Administration came second wining the prize of #60,000 Naira.

LOOKING FORWARD

The COVID – 19 pandemic is still lingering but we look up to 2022 with hope that we can achieve on our mandate. Below are some of the major activities that will engage us in 2022.

1. New Programmes

- The pre-validation visits from NUC for our senate approved programmes is being awaited. The new programmes are: -
- i. Postgraduate Diploma in Education
- ii. B.Ed. Guidance & Counseling
- iii. B.Sc. Finance
- iv. B.Ed. Educational Management

We hope that the four programmes will be mounted in the 2022/2023 academic year.

- The module writing for the other two programmes B.Sc. Employment Relations and Personnel Management and B.Sc. Social Work has got to an advanced stage and it is hoped that in due course they too will be ready for NUC pre-validation visit.
- Two new programmes will be mounted in the current academic year 2021/2022. These are BA. Education/English and B.Sc. Education, Economics as a result of the number of applicantions received.
- In collaboration with the Department of Adult Education we are proposing to develop the ODL mode for the Masters Programme in Community Development and Social Welfare. The proposal is still under consideration at the School of Postgraduate Studies.

2. Staff Development

- Management Retreat that was postponed in 2020 & 2021 due to COVID 19 will be actualized this year hopefully.
- Academic Staff Training in all areas of need in ODL will continue.
 Commonwealth of Learning has offered to give one training this year through RETRIDOL
- Sponsorship to learned academic conferences is available to staff within the confines of budgetary allocation.
- Administrative and Technical Staff will continue to be sponsored for Capacity Building in their respective areas to improve their performance.

3. Student Development

- The approved Flexible Payment Plan (FPP) will be activated in the 2021/2022 academic session. The FPP is a revised template that reduces the burden of reabsorption fees for our students. The expected outcome is to get more students to come back and complete their programmes and reduce attribution rate.
- The Centre for Entrepreneurship and Skills Development
 The centre is planning a programme for our students to integrate them into the mainstream Entrepreneurship and skills development program of the University.
- Digital skills workshop will be organized for students who need it between March – June 2022.

4. Infrastructural Development

The Management is determined to keep improving both the physical and ICT infrastructure in the Institute to improve on the overall working environment. For 2022 the Management anticipates to do the following:-

- The 350KVA Generator which was purchased from JUPEB will be commissioned to provide improved alternative power for uninterrupted processes.
- Renovation of Toilets in Block A & B will be completed.
- Refurbishment of the Institute water supply system will be completed. The metal tanks will be changed to PVC.
- Raising Philanthropic funds to establish an Equal Opportunities (PLWD) CBT room will be vigorously pursued.
- A new bigger and higher capacity server will be purchased to replace the old one whose capacity is limited for our students' population going forward.
- Renovation of offices and purchase of office furniture and equipment will be facilitated vigorously in 2022.
- Laptop for academic staff Laptops will be procured for the remaining academic staff who have not been given previously.
